JUDGMENT BY COURT

27 This matter came on regularly for hearing on April 13, 2001,
28 at 8:30 a.m. in front of the Honorable Joan Ettinger,

Commissioner presiding. Cross-complainant Hanover Commercial Services, Inc. doing business as Best Temporary Services appeared by David G. Moore, Esq. of the firm Reid & Hellyer. The court, having heard evidence in the form of sworn testimony, having taken judicial notice of the case of People v. Sharon Logan, Riverside Superior Court Case No. RIF 090464, having reviewed documents and having noted the default of cross-defendant Sharon Jean Logan aka Sharon Jean Hecox was first entered on December 16, 1999, makes the following findings and judgment.

1. That at the fifth cause of action for constructive fraud and the sixth cause of action for breach of fiduciary duty is supported by the evidence as against cross-defendant Sharon Jean Logan aka Sharon Jean Hecox;

2. That cross-defendant Sharon Jean Logan also known as Sharon Jean Hecox committed constructive fraud and breach of fiduciary duties by reason of theft and embezzlement from her employer, Hanover Commercial Services, Inc. a corporation, doing business as Best Temporary Services of the sum of \$249,032.15;


3. That cross-defendant Sharon Logan also known as Sharon Jean Hecox was convicted of a felony in connection with the theft and embezzlement of these monies in the case of People v. Sharon Logan, Riverside Superior Court Case No. RIF 090464, was committed to state prison and has been ordered by that court to pay restitution in the sum of \$150,000.

Given the above findings,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, JUDGED AND DECREED that cross-complainant Hanover Commercial Services, Inc. a California corporation doing business as Best Temporary Services recover
